
Message from Our Founder & President



Grapenut & Kashi went home with the Coltrane Family. Look at this wonderful photo.





Shelter Cat Enrichment Activities

Thanks to a grant from the Nothstein Cerasa Foundation, we were able to implement some unique enrichment activities. These stimulate the cats through their senses of smell, sight, sound, taste and touch. We now have new tools in the shelter such as essential oil diffusers, spices, perpetual motion toys, mobiles, lava lamps, sound machines, recordings of birds, puzzle feeders and brand-new climbing perches.

In late September, the team at SAFE Haven became aware of a dire situation in the Triangle concerning 22 young cats and kittens. The story is a common one, but nonetheless, unfortunate, and one we have seen repeatedly in our community. Sometimes, well-intentioned people think that penning up stray cats outside is a way to protect them from predators or other harm. Because they can breed, are exposed to the elements and are crowded in a small space, the animals end up suffering terribly.
