# Message from Pam Miller, Founder & President

Dear Friends of SAFE Haven,

I am so happy to report that thanks to you (our supporters, adopters, volunteers, and community partners) we have saved more lives this past fiscal year than at any time in the 28 year history of SAFE Haven for Cats.

As you will read in this annual report, we have accomplished much in the past 12 months.

- **Found homes** for 1,247 cats and kittens through our adoption program. (300 more than last year)
- **Sterilized** 5,647 kitties and dogs in the SAFE Care Clinic. (3,600 more than last year)
- Happily, completed our **13,000th adoption!** (See photo of Piston on page 4)
- **Provided TNVR** services to 2,080 community cats
- Gave out **16 tons of food** to needy cats and dogs (an increase of 5 tons)
- Continued our partnership with our friends at the Purr Cup Café, Raleigh's first and only cat café.

Everything we planned with the completion of our 2020/21 expansion is coming true for the animals in our community. Our capacity has increased, our waitlist times have shortened, and we are able to serve more animals and people everyday thanks to you.

We also won a few awards this year. Both WRAL and the INDY, voted us as the Best Non-Profit Organization in Wake County and the Best Place to Volunteer. This is what the INDY said about us:



Here at the INDY, we love our cats (and dogs, too, of course). So, it warms our hearts that readers chose this Raleigh institution as the best nonprofit in Wake County. The no-kill shelter is a beloved refuge for stray and abandoned cats, who receive full medical attention and all the tender loving care they deserve while the organization seeks to place the kitties in permanent homes. Aside from helping strays find new families, SAFE Haven also provides low-cost spay/neuter services through their specialty clinic, which has been benefiting our feline friends for over 25 years and counting.

With our programs and services at SAFE Haven, last year we helped people and animals in 35 North Carolina counties. Wake County is hovering at around a 10% euthanasia rate for cats. Some of our neighboring counties are as high as 68% but all these numbers have decreased dramatically in the last 3 years. With your help, we can continue to help people in this part of the State, decrease unwanted births, and eliminate euthanasia of healthy animals once and for all!


# Because of YOU ... We are Saving Innocent Lives Every Day!

Your generous support saved many, many lives at SAFE Haven this year, and you are the main reason for our shared success. Below is our "annual report" infographic so you can see all the good we are accomplishing together. We provided services to 13,485 animals and people this year (a 50% increase) at a cost of \$105.07 each. The only way we are able to meet this challenge and provide these vital services is with the support of 447 unselfish volunteers who donated 14,265 hours of time this year with a value of \$427,236. In addition, \$59,684 worth of food, towels, beds, and other in-kind services were donated in 2021/2022.

# **Adoption Program Recap**

# 1,247 Cats and Kittens Find Happy Homes!

The expansion we completed in 2020/21 has continued to have the impact we planned for! As a result, we adopted three hundred more cats this year – over a 25% increase. A better physical environment is also helping cats get adopted faster. Once they are ready for adoption it only takes our cats or kittens a little over 7 days (average) to go to their new homes. Two hundred and forty-two of these kitties also spent time in one of our sixty-five foster homes. Kittens and young adults made up the bulk of our foster placements although one foster cat, Fancy Step, was over fifteen years old.

We are very grateful for our two-year-old partnership with the Purr Cup Café where **88 SAFE Haven cats** have been adopted in the last twelve months.


In May, Piston became our **13,000th adoption!**He went home with a prize package full of everything a kitty could need, to a lovely family in Clayton.

# Adoption Program Recap Who are these 1,247 cats?

People are always curious about where all these cats come from. Well, here is the answer! They were all former stray, abandoned, injured, or orphaned cats and kittens – mostly from the Triangle.

# Where they came from . . .

- 70% stray cats directly from the community
- 23% partner euthanizing shelters (Johnston County, Franklin County, Wake County and Granville County Animal Shelters)
- 6% life of the cat in danger
- <1% abandoned at the shelter</p>



\*All of our mature kitties go home with a Mature Companions Certificate that provides:

Free phone consultations with our veterinarian and a free annual check-up with vaccines.

# Our Community Cares— And it Shows!

SAFE Haven places many cats each year that come to us in not-quite-perfect condition. After all, these are all stray, abandoned, orphaned, and sometimes injured cats and kittens. How we wish they could talk to us; tell us where they have been. But we make a commitment to restore them to health and find them a permanent home regardless of their former circumstances. Here are some examples of what your support makes possible.

# Shamu

This little 11 month old female kitty came to us very sick and very underweight. After full blood work and x-rays, it was determined that she had suffered from a very heavy infestation of parasites that had inflamed her lungs! After extensive treatment with dewormers and steroids, Shamu gained weight, got healthy, and went home to her new loving family.





# **Mintaka**

A very sweet kitty came to us with a 6/6 heart murmur. We sent her for a cardiac ultrasound. It revealed a hole in her ventricles where blood is flowing back and forth causing the heart murmur. There is no cure for this congenital abnormality which will most likely will shorten her life span. She acts like a very normal kitty with no issues and was adopted soon, as you can see from her adoption day photo.




# **Our Community Cares continued**

And bi-lateral cryptorchid which means his testicles had not descended and were in his stomach. Surgery fixed him right up (on both counts) and he found his forever home shortly afterwards.

# SAFE Care Clinic Impact on our Community

This summer the SAFE Care Clinic celebrated twenty-one years of spaying and neutering! One of only a handful of low cost clinics in the State, we have **completed over 41,782 surgeries!** (5,647 in 2021/2022.)

Imagine if each one of them had a litter of four kittens, who themselves had kittens at 6 months. Well, you do the math – it is a lot of kittens who there may not be enough homes for.

## Our goals for the SAFE Care Clinic are simple:

- Decrease euthanasia through high quality, low cost sterilization of cats and dogs.
- ♣ Increase our capacity year after year. This year's goal is 6,500 surgeries!
- Reduce wait times for appointments.

Imagine how many litters she produced!

- Keep the price for these services as low as possible.
- Never turn anyone away because they can't pay!

# **SAFE Care Clinic continued**

We do not turn anyone away from the SAFE Care Clinic. Last year **31% did not pay the full price and 73% had not had any veterinary care in the past year.** Events like Spay-ghetti and No Balls are ways we raise funds for the clinic.

We also sterilized **1,351 cats and kittens as a vital service to thirteen cat rescue groups** and humane societies in the Triangle so they will never have to adopt out unsterilized animals. They include: Alley Cats & Angels, Beautiful Together, Best Friend Pet Adoption, Franklin County Animal Services, FCAS/ Paws for Life, Marden's Cat Tales, Friends of Wake County (Kitty Clip), the SPCA of Franklin County, Paw Prints Rescue, Purr Partners, Purrfect Hearts, Second Chance Pet Adoptions, and Neshama Animal Rescue.



### **Foundation Grants**

As you might imagine, unlike human causes there are very few grants available for animals. Although grants make up a small percentage of our income, SAFE Haven wants to gratefully acknowledge the support of the following for the SAFE Care Clinic: *The Margaret T. Petrie Spaying and Neutering Foundation and The Summerlee Foundation.* 

# SAFE Haven's TNVR Mission

Part of the recent expansion of our services allowed us to lower our sterilization fees for feral cats to only \$40 including vaccines! Why? Because there are around 70 million feral cats in the United States and plenty here in the Triangle. Sterilization reduces these numbers and euthanasia. We sterilized 2,080 feral cats in the last twelve months in the clinic.

# What is that ear tip?

Have you seen a cat with the tip of its left ear removed? That signifies that that cat has already been sterilized!



# We support the community in other ways to help feral cats:

- Loan of humane traps and training/support to safely catch elusive cats (over 95 loaned per year)
- Provide classes on TNVR to the community
- We maintain a confidential, third party registry that can help reclaim a feral cat in Wake County at safecareclinic.org
- Offer free food for feral colony caretakers
- We are the home of Operation Catnip, the Triangle's oldest feral cat sterilization program. Hosted one Sunday a month at SAFE Care, OC sterilized 877 feral cats last year.



# The Pet Food Pantry

Last year we distributed 16 tons of food supporting 155 families with 508 cats and 125 dogs. People in need can apply for help from the Pantry. Just a few simple rules: They can't have any more than six animals, cannot adopt any more pets while receiving food from the Pantry, and SAFE Haven assists them to assure 100% of their pets are spayed and neutered. Last year we held two very successful pet food drives for the Pantry in which 28,000 pounds were donated.

# The Purr Cup Café

Our cats are really loving the attention and exposure they get at our partner the Purr Cup Café. Raleigh's only cat café opened in October 2020, and as of this writing 174 SAFE Haven cats have been adopted. # WE ARE THANKFUL FOR YOU



**Thanks to 8,995 individual gifts** from compassionate animal people, SAFE Haven met its financial goals this past fiscal year. Additionally, we successfully managed our expenses and benefited from \$427,236 of donated time from our volunteers. Over \$13,896 of cat food, paper towels, toys, litter, and other supplies were donated to the cats. In addition, \$45,788 in goods and services were donated to our Tuxedo Cat Ball.



Kitten Shower Supply Donations May 2022

Donations are vital to our organization since adoption fees/clinic fees do not cover the basic medical care of the cats SAFE Haven takes into our shelter and helps in our clinic. In addition, as a No Kill shelter, we believe in treating every medical condition we are able to – just like you do for your beloved pets. You may not know it, but as a private, non-profit animal shelter, we do not get any funds from the City of Raleigh, Wake County, or the State of North Carolina. **Because it is of the utmost importance, we continue to offer no cost or** 

low-cost sterilization services to every person/cat in our community who needs it, the support of our donors is vital to our mission. Several hundred cats who use the spay/neuter services of the clinic have never been to a veterinarian. Were it not for the availability of these services, many cats would go unneutered and hundreds of homeless kittens would be born.









The following charts show you (our supporters) how your dollars are spent and what the major expenses and income of the organization are.


# **Expenses by Category**



# Beagle Day at SAFE Haven for Cats

On Sunday, August 14, 2022 the SAFE Care Clinic was happy to partner with Triangle Beagle Rescue to help with the last step for 40 beagles rescued from the Envigo breeding facility in Virginia. Envigo bred these dogs to be sold to labs for experimentation. A federal judge ordered the release of approximately 4,000 dogs from the facility owned by Envigo after it was found in violation of several federal regulations. The Humane Society of the U.S. worked with federal authorities to rehome the dogs, and Triangle Beagle Rescue took over 100. Only problem – there was no one willing to spay/neuter them!

That is where we offered our facilities for a day long spay/neutera-thon! As you can see from all these photos it was a great day for both organizations but especially for the dogs.
